The first account of William R. Nicholson, executor of the estate of the late Congressman William D. Kelley, who died in January, 1890, was filed with the Register of Wills yesterday, and will come up for adjudication before the Orphans' Court next month. The account shows that the estate, including all accumulations since the death of the testator, amounts to \$206.877.89. Of this amount \$35,894.68 consists of personal property, and \$169,823.30 was received from the sale of twenty-three dwelling houses and building lots, located principally in West Philadelphia, and held in half interest by Judge Kelley. The disbursements during the same period have amounted to \$142,902.59. leaving a balance on hand at the time of making the report of \$63,975.30, which, with the exception of \$4,511.36 cash in hand, is variously invested.
