M. T. MOLONEY DIES AT OTTAWA

Ottawa, Ill., March 9.—[Special.]—Maurice T. Moloney, former attorney general of Illinois, died here today from paralysis. He was 68 years old.

He was elected city attorney in 1870, reelected in 1881, chosen state's attorney in 1884, attorney general of Illinois in 1892, and mayor of Ottawa in 1899.
