HISTORY OF THE SUPREME COURT,

How and When It Was First Formed—Duties Who Have Held Since.

The Supreme Court of Illinois was created by the Constitution of 1818, and at first consisted of one Chief Justice and three Associate

Caton, and Lyman Trumbull were elected. The first two were on the bench at the time the election was held, so Lyman Trumbull was the only new name. From the adoption of the Constitution of 1818 until the court was increased from three to seven members under the Constitution of 1870 the following were the new Justices elected:

The Supreme Court at present has but six members, Justice John Schmid having died within the last week. Following are the present Justices:

John H. Dyer, Chicago, Chief Justice; David J. Baker, Cairo; James W. Wilkins, Decatur; Simon F. Simon, Lowystown; Alfred M. Craig, Galesburg; and Joseph M. Bailey, Freeport.

Dec. 29, 1824, the Legislature relieved the Supreme Court Justices of Circuit Court duties, and for a little over two years the members of the higher court had a comparatively easy time of it. Jan. 12, 1827, however, they were again given Circuit Court duties to perform, and were not again relieved of them until Jan. 7, 1835, although Jan. 8, 1829, a Cir-

cuit Court Judge was appointed to assist in the work, and another was added Jan. 21, 1828.

From 1828 to 1850 the Supreme Court appointments were as follows:

Increase to Nine.

There were no more appointments until 1841, when the court was increased to nine members, and the Justices were again required to perform Circuit Court duties. From



then until 1848, when the court was reduced to three members, relieved of Circuit Court work, and given a nine-year term of office, placing them beyond the power of partisan legislators. There were many changes, the appointments being as follows:
